

Sick of chasing renegade paper plates across the lawn during breezy backyard chowdowns? Invest in more substantial (but still outdoor-friendly) tableware in resilient materials like rubber and rayon. That way, you, like your dishes, can stay firmly planted all evening long.

1. These rayon-paper-blend napkins feel more like cloth than most disposable options do, and look smarter too. \$4 for a pack of 20, sprouthome.com. 2. Patterned oilcloth makes for a chic waterproof table cover (or a set of placemats). Potlucks by Marimekko, \$48 per yard, cotton.com. 3. Rubber bowls are food-safe and practically indestructible.
